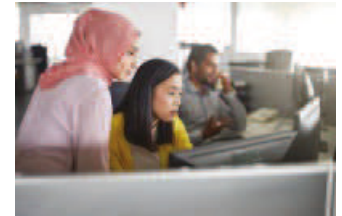

I currently use Cochrane reviews for several purposes in my institutions and in particular for health technology assessment (HTA) reports that are very useful for making evidence-based decisions in healthcare.

HTA reports are a systematic evaluation of properties, effects, and/or impacts of health technology. It is a multidisciplinary process to evaluate the medical, social, economic, organizational, and ethical issues of a health intervention or health technology. Hospital-based HTA reports are very useful documents for decision-makers in the hospitals and they should include the best available evidence on a health technology. As head of Innovation Service and Hospital-based HTA Unit, I consider Cochrane reviews very useful for HTA reports because they are internationally recognised as the highest standard documents in evidence-based health care.
